Every spring, many people around the world celebrate¹ a holiday² called⁷ Easter. The date changes every year, but it is always on a Sunday in March or April.


Easter is an old holiday. Some people believe "Easter" was the name of a goddess of spring.

American Spirit: Saving Lives

Japanese students might know the US for hamburgers, the Grand Canyon, and Hollywood movies. But the US is known for many other things as well. One of these is volunteerism¹.

46% of Americans volunteer. Most American ⁵ firefighters are volunteers. Many people unofficially² volunteer by helping neighbors³, teaching children, or helping in soup kitchens⁴.

25% of Americans volunteer in official organizations⁵. They officially volunteer for an ¹⁰ average of 50 hours a year. Their volunteering is equal to almost \$175 billion of unpaid⁶ work.

One very famous volunteer organization helps save lives all over the world. After the 2011 Tohoku earthquake⁷, this group sent \$350¹⁵ million in aid⁸. This group sent 23 medical teams⁹ and 5,000 blankets¹⁰ to Kumamoto in 2016. This group's purpose is "to prevent and alleviate human suffering¹¹."

This group is the **Red Cross**¹².

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What are some other famous volunteer organizations?

- Habitat for Humanity (人類の生息地:住宅支援を 行うNGO) builds houses for the poor.
- Doctors Without Borders (国境なき医師団) and the International Medical Corps (国際医療隊) provide medical care in poor countries.
- The Make-A-Wish Foundation (「ねがいごとを する」団体) makes the dreams of sick children come true.


